

**SPECIAL & REGULAR MEETING OF  
THE VILLAGE OF CLEMMONS COUNCIL  
MAY 11, 2015**

The Village of Clemmons Council met on Monday, May 11, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the Village Hall, Clemmons, North Carolina. The following members were present: Mayor Nelson and Council Members Cameron, Denny, Roark, Lawry and Rogers. Staff members present were: Interim Manager Kirby, Finance Officer Stroud, Planner Ledbetter, Public Works Director Gunnell, Public Works Director of Operations Gearren, Marketing/Communications Director Ford, Clerk Shortt and Attorney Kasper.

**Call to Order**

Mayor Nelson called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

**Business – Special Meeting**

Budget Workshop for Fiscal Year 2015-2016. The budget workshop continued from the April 27, 2015 meeting. Finance Officer Stroud started the budget discussion with Occupancy Tax Appropriations. At the previous meeting, Council added \$500.00 to Community Day. Council Member Lawry had questions about Movies on Lawn and its exact cost, Marketing/Communications Director Ford indicated that the cost for two movies would be \$2,000.00. Finance Officer Stroud and Marketing/Communications Director Ford discussed possible options for \$20,250 which were an Explore Clemmons webpage and a Visitor's Guide, however there were no specific recommendations. Marketing/Communications Director Ford would like more time to research and develop a marketing plan to determine the best options for our money and would present findings to Council for decision and approval. Council Member Lawry requested that we research a way to distribute handouts at Tanglewood Festival of Lights to encourage visitors to spend some time in Clemmons. Council Member Cameron requested that the Clemmons Library request be outside the grant process and Council Member Rogers indicated he would like to leave the \$45,000 in grants which would bring the total Occupancy Tax Appropriations to \$105,000.00. The next discussion item was Parks and Recreation. Council Member Lawry requested further clarification of Park Lake Steps which Larry Kirby and Steve Gearren provided. Capital Outlay discussion followed. Council Member Lawry had questions about replacement of L-5 and Dump Truck. L-5 is a 2005 piece of equipment that has started to have major maintenance issues and downtime, therefore Public Works would like to purchase new limb truck with the expectation of keeping L-5 for backup to use when volume is heavy. The current dump truck is rusted due to salt. Council Member Lawry questioned how could we keep the new dump truck from doing the same thing. Steve Gearren indicated that Public Works is looking into new products or options which would help with this issue. Council Member Lawry had requested clarification about the lights at Greendale Park which Manager Kirby provided. Last item was Stormwater Utility which there were no questions therefore completing the budget discussion. Manager Kirby stated the budget message will be presented at the May 26<sup>th</sup> meeting with the budget numbers that were discussed at the budget workshop. Council will have the option to make any changes they wish. Council will call for a public hearing on June 8<sup>th</sup> and then approve the budget before June 30.

Mayor Nelson called for a recess at 6:26 p.m.

Mayor Nelson reconvened the meeting at 7 p.m.

### **Pledge of Allegiance (Regular Meeting)**

Mayor Nelson and the Boy Scouts led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **Public Comments**

There were 27 citizens in attendance. Six individuals signed in to speak:

- PJ Lofland, 1460 Lake Cottage Road, Clemmons, NC – referenced comments made about her in the Clemmons Courier Letter to the Editor then thanked Council for their not approving The Retreat at Clemmons and their looking out for the safety and well-being of the citizens of Clemmons.
- Keela Johnson, 3550 Stancliff Road, Clemmons, NC – small business owner of Forsyth Woman magazine and the annual publication of Forsyth Community – expressed her thoughts on the funding/grant process to promote Clemmons by stating the Village of Clemmons should support and encourage the idea of allocated funds for the local economy.
- Christina Johnson, 1483 River Ridge Drive, Clemmons, NC – small business owner of Christina's Dessertery – expressed her thoughts on the Occupancy Tax Funding/Grant Process as her business is primarily comprised of the wedding market and those guests stimulate the local economy.
- Jason Skinner, 6000 Meadowbrook Mall Circle, Clemmons, NC – owner of Paparazzi Hair Salon – expressed his support of grant funding for The Village Inn as they draw approximately 5 customers a week at \$30 each due to the marketing by The Village Inn.
- Errol Rich, 4325 Winterberry Ridge Circle, Clemmons, NC – stated Clemmons is a great place to live and advised on the Forsyth County Sheriff's Academy explaining the extensiveness of the training program. He also directed a comment to Marketing/Communications Director Shannon Ford stating marketing is the backbone and the Village of Clemmons needs to support.
- Dana Bryson, 2756 Knob Hill Drive, Clemmons, NC – expressed her thoughts on the Occupancy Tax Funding/Grant Process stating there is approximately \$200k in reserves and \$45k in grant funding. She explained how the marketing dollars would be self-replenishing each month as the bed tax draws money. She advised that she spends approximately \$140k a year to market her one venue. She encouraged Council to come up with a goal and allow Marketing/Communications Director Ford to come up with a marketing plan to support grant funding.

### **Approval of the Minutes**

Council Member Cameron moved to approve the minutes of the March 17, 2015 Special Meeting, April 27, 2015 Regular Meeting and May 4, 2015 Special Meeting. The motion was seconded by Council Member Lawry and unanimously approved.

### **Approval of the Agenda**

Council Member Rogers requested an addition to Announcements:

#### E. Pedal and Metal Fest

Council Member Cameron requested to expound upon Item B. under the Business portion of the agenda regarding Forsyth County Sheriff's Academy

Mayor Nelson requested an addition to Closed Session to Discuss Personnel Matter in accordance with NCGS 143-318.11(a)(3)

Interim Manager Kirby requested an addition to Item F. Manager's Report:

#### 5. Resolution 2015-R-06 Accepting Clock Tower

Council Member Rogers moved to approve the agenda as amended. The motion was seconded by Council Member Roark and unanimously approved.

#### Announcements

Mayor Nelson announced that the Village Offices will be closed Monday, May 25, 2015 for Memorial Day and the next Regular Council Meeting will be at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, May 26, 2015.

Mayor Nelson introduced City of Winston-Salem Project Planner Kelly Bennett who presented the City-County Arts Incentive which is expected to increase tourism and enhance roadways. Mr. Bennett advised that the City of Winston-Salem has adopted the City-County Public Art Plan which stems from the Legacy 2030 Process (Comp Plan) and they are inviting other towns to participate in the process. He advised that in the past, public art was typically done by non-profit organizations and created some issues as far as right-of-ways due to space needed. They are looking to establish a committee comprised of nine members. The committee would be known as the Public Art Commission. Initial thoughts are that the committee would consist of six members from the City of Winston-Salem as 2/3 of Forsyth County population is from Winston-Salem and the remaining three members would be from Forsyth County towns. There will be an Inter-local Agreement drawn up to develop the commission. Mr. Bennett stated that the City of Winston-Salem will provide future funding and at this time Forsyth County has adopted the Plan.

Marketing/Communications Director Shannon Ford and Interim Manager Larry Kirby recognized Public Works Director/Village Engineer Mike Gunnell for the Municipal Administration course completion through UNC School of Government. This course is designed for city and county managers, department heads, and other city or county officials whose responsibilities require an understanding of functions beyond individual areas of specialization. The focus was on: Local Government Law, Organization & Management, Finance & Budgeting, Public Employment Law, Planning & Regulation of Development, and Municipal & County Services. Mike Gunnell thanked Council, Mayor Nelson and Manager Kirby for their support. Council Member Rogers praised Mr. Gunnell for the great job he is doing in Public Works.

Public Works Week Proclamation. Mayor Nelson proclaimed May 17-23, 2015 as Public Works Week for the Village of Clemmons (attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference).

Council Member Rogers advised of the upcoming Pedal and Metal Fest which will be taking place on Saturday, May 16, 2015 from 2-5 p.m. at Morgan Elementary School. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> year for the Village of Clemmons offering a free for all ages bike event to encourage healthy activity. There will also be the ribbon cutting for the Village Point Greenway along with three dedicated bike rides of which the first will be led by Mayor Nelson, Touch-A-Truck, kids crafts, balloon animal artistry, face painting and a bike/trike parade. The sponsors for the Pedal and Metal Fest are: Morgan Elementary School, Wake Forest Baptist Health, Clemmons Bicycle, Jerry Long YMCA, Lowes Foods, Novant Health, and Village of Clemmons.

### **Business**

A. Ordinance Enacting and Adopting Supplement 19 to the Code of Ordinances. The ordinance enacts and adopts Supplement 19 which contains State legislation current through 2014 and Local legislation current through Ordinance 2014-08, passed November 24, 2014. (Attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Rogers moved to approved An Ordinance Enacting and Adopting Supplements to the Code of Ordinances for the Village of Clemmons. The motion was seconded by Council Member Cameron and unanimously approved

B. Consideration of the Agreement with Forsyth County and the Forsyth County Sheriff's Department for Community Policing. The total annual cost is \$1,078,008. This is a two-year agreement commencing July 1, 2015 and ending on June 30, 2017. (Attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Rogers moved to approve the agreement with Forsyth County and the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office for community policing for \$1,078,008. The motion was seconded by Council Member Cameron and unanimously approved.

C. Attorney's Report.

1. *Discussion of Peddler and Panhandler Ordinances.* There was discussion on the recent calls received by the Village of Clemmons in reference to peddler and panhandling activities. Further discussion will take place at the next Council meeting to determine how to proceed.

D. Planner's Report. Nothing new to report.

E. Marketing/Communications Director's Report.

1. *Tourism/Occupancy Tax Grant Application.* The Tourism/Occupancy Tax Grant Application was presented. The grant program will designate \$45,000 that will award money to local nonprofits and businesses to plan and promote events. The amount granted will be between \$500 to \$10,000, and potential grant applicants must attend a workshop May 29 at Village Hall. Grants will be awarded using a point system. (Attached hereto as Exhibit D and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Roark moved to approve the Tourism/Occupancy Tax Grant Application. The motion was seconded by Council Member Rogers and unanimously approved.

2. *Facebook Page and Village of Clemmons Social Media Comments Policy.* An update was presented on the Facebook Page along with a draft for the Village of Clemmons Social Media Comments Policy. Council Member Cameron requested a change in the wording in regards to the content posted to the Village of Clemmons' social media site by the public to reflect "must" instead of "should" be related to the Village sponsored programs, services, projects, issues, events and activities. Council Member Cameron also requested the sentence "The Village therefore asks that no requests for emergency service or immediate response be made through social media" be in bold print. Council Member Lawry requested a statement for the public to call 911 in case of an emergency. (Attached hereto as Exhibit E and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Rogers moved to approve the launch of the Facebook Page along with the amended Village of Clemmons Social Media Comments Policy. The motion was seconded by Council Member Roark and unanimously approved.

F. Manager's Report.

1. *Spring Cleanup.* Information on the cleanup was shared by Stormwater Technician Emily Harrison - 80 people participated and 55 bags of trash were picked up per person covering approximately 17 miles of roadway. She stated her appreciation for the support from the community, sponsors and volunteers. Council Member Rogers thanked the Public Works staff for their dedication and effort.

2. *False Alarm Report.* Report was presented. Discussion on how to go about collecting on the outstanding fees took place. Council Member Cameron advised if there is an ordinance in place, then it needs to be enforced. Attorney Kasper advised the filing fee with the court is approximately \$150 - \$200 for each business and he will check on the 3-year Statute of Limitations for each violation. The current total outstanding fees are \$4,200. (Attached hereto as Exhibit F and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Roark moved to approve court filing for collection of outstanding false alarm fees as presented. The motion was seconded by Council Member Rogers and unanimously approved.

3. *Forsyth County Sheriff's Report.* Report was presented. Council Member Cameron reported that she and her husband recently attended the Forsyth County Sheriff's Academy and recommended anyone interested should make the time to attend in the future. She experienced an overview of the amount of rigorous training and job detail that a deputy performs in doing the day-to-day aspects of their job to serve and protect the citizens along with touring the facilities.

4. *NCDOT Village Point Drive Minutes.* Minutes were presented and Manager Kirby advised the next scheduled meeting will be Thursday, May 14, 2015.

5. *Resolution 2015-R-06 Accepting Clock Tower.* Resolution 2015-R-06 Accepting Clock Tower was presented. (Attached hereto as Exhibit G and incorporated as a part of the minutes.)

Council Member Cameron moved to approve Resolution 2015-R-06 as presented. The motion was seconded by Council Member Roark and unanimously approved.

G. Council Comments.

Council Member Lawry thanked Manager Kirby for securing the statistical information from the Sheriff's Department.

Council Member Rogers advised that regarding the Grant Process, the Village of Clemmons will be working with all businesses in Clemmons for all types of events.

WXII will be featuring Celebrating Clemmons on Wednesday, May 20, 2015 beginning at the 5:00 a.m. newscast. They will be stationed throughout the day at the Jerry Long YMCA.

H. Closed Session to discuss personnel matter in accordance with NCGS 143-318.11(a)(3) and discuss property acquisition in accordance with NCGS 143-318.11(a)(5). Council Member Lawry moved to go into closed session to discuss property acquisition in accordance with NCGS 143-18.11(a)(5) at 8:05 p.m. The motion was seconded by Council Member Roark and unanimously approved.


At 10:35 p.m., Mayor Nelson stated that by unanimous vote Council chose to reconvene the open session. No action was taken.



AN ORDINANCE ENACTING AND ADOPTING SUPPLEMENTS TO THE  
CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE VILLAGE OF CLEMMONS,  
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio has completed the 18th Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Clemmons, which supplement contains all ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted since the prior supplement to the Code of Ordinances of this Village of Clemmons; and

WHEREAS, American Legal Publishing Corporation has recommended the revision or addition of certain sections of the Code of Ordinances which are based on or make reference to sections of the North Carolina code; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Village Council to accept these updated sections in accordance with the changes of the law of the State of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide for the daily operation of the municipality and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the municipality that this ordinance take effect at an early date;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CLEMMONS:

Section 1. That the 18th Supplement to the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Clemmons as submitted by American Legal Publishing Corporation of Cincinnati, Ohio, and as attached hereto, be and the same is hereby adopted by reference as if set out in its entirety.

Section 2. Such supplements shall be deemed published as of the day of its adoption and approval by the Village Council and the Clerk of the Village of Clemmons is hereby authorized and ordered to insert such supplements into the copy of the Code of Ordinances kept on file in the Office of the Clerk.

Section 3. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of this municipality, and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.

## CHAPTER 70: TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

### Section

- 70.01 Stop signs
- 70.02 Trucks prohibited
- 70.03 Flow of traffic on certain streets adjoining Clemmons Elementary School
  
- 70.99 Penalty

### § 70.01 STOP SIGNS.

(A) The Director of Public Works shall install stop signs at the locations indicated in Chapter 72, Schedule II.

(B) When stop signs are erected as provided in this section at or near the entrance to any intersection, every driver of a vehicle shall stop the vehicle at the sign before entering the intersection, except when directed to proceed by a law enforcement officer.

(C) After the driver of the vehicle has stopped in obedience to a stop sign at an intersection, he shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles which are within the intersection or which are approaching so closely as to constitute an immediate hazard.

(Ord. 91-5, passed 10-21-91) Penalty, see § 70.99

### § 70.02 TRUCKS PROHIBITED.

(A) The operation of a motor vehicle having more than two axles or a gross licensed weight exceeding 16,000 pounds is prohibited on the following described portions of certain public streets:

- (1) Stadium Drive from its intersection with U.S. Highway 158 to its intersection with Brookland Drive;
- (2) Ridgecrest Road from its intersection with Kinnamon Road to its intersection with Stadium Drive;
- (3) Bingham Avenue from its intersection with Stadium Drive to its terminus;
- (4) Stoney Drive from its intersection with James Street to its terminus; and

(5) James Street from its intersection with U.S. Highway 158 to its intersection with Cook Avenue.

(B) All publicly owned or operated vehicles, fire trucks, ambulances or other emergency vehicles, garbage or recycling trucks or vehicles making a delivery directly to a property abutting the aforementioned streets shall be exempt from the operation of this section. A civil penalty of \$100 shall be imposed for non-compliance.

**§ 70.03 FLOW OF TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN STREETS ADJOINING CLEMMONS  
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.**

(A) When school is in session at Clemmons Elementary School, and during the hours from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., it shall be prohibited for the operator of a motor vehicle to make a left turn from Bingham Avenue onto Stadium Drive.

(B) The Director of Public Works is directed to and shall erect appropriate signage to give drivers notice of this section.

(C) Violation of this section shall be punishable upon conviction as an infraction with a minimum fine of \$25 as provided in § 70.99.

**§ 70.99 PENALTY.**

Any person who violates any provision of this traffic code for which no specific penalty is otherwise provided shall be guilty of an infraction punishable upon conviction by a fine not exceeding \$50, as provided in G.S. § 14-4(b).

### **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

#### **§ 95.01 PURPOSE.**

This chapter is for the purpose of preventing, abating and controlling air pollution resulting from air contaminants released by the open burning of refuse or other combustible materials.  
(Ord. 94-16, passed 9-19-94)

#### **§ 95.02 APPLICATION.**

This chapter shall apply to all operations involving open burning, except those specifically exempted by § 95.11.  
(Ord. 94-16, passed 9-19-94)

***OPEN BURNING*****§ 95.10 GENERAL PROHIBITION.**

No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit open burning of refuse or other combustible material, except as covered by a permit issued pursuant to the authority granted by G.S. § 143-215.  
(Ord. 94-16, passed 9-19-94)

**§ 95.11 PERMISSIBLE BURNING, GENERALLY.**

(A) While recognizing that open burning contributes to air pollution, the Village Council is aware that certain types of open burning may reasonably be allowed in the public interest; therefore, the following types of open burning are permissible as specified, if burning is not prohibited by ordinances and regulations of governmental entities having jurisdiction.

(B) (1) Open burning is allowed in Clemmons as outlined under the regulatory allowances and restrictions as in the Forsyth County Air Quality Control Ordinance and Technical Code, § 1900.

(2) Open burning of leaves, tree branches, or yard trimmings originating on the premises of private residences is prohibited.

(C) Any persons wishing to engage in the types of burning allowed by this section and the Forsyth County Air Quality Control Ordinance and Technical Code must first secure permission by obtaining a burning permit from the Forsyth County Environmental Affairs Department.

(D) Permission granted under this section will be subject to continued review and may be withdrawn at any time.

**§ 95.12 COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS.**

The authority to conduct open burning under the provisions of § 95.11 does not exempt or excuse any person from the consequences, damages or injuries which may result from such conduct nor does it excuse or exempt any person from complying with all applicable laws, ordinances, regulations and orders of the governmental entities having jurisdiction, even though the open burning is conducted in compliance with § 95.11.

(C) *Posting of signs required.* The Village Manager is hereby directed to post appropriate signage on each building or portion of a building now or hereafter owned, leased as lessee, operated, occupied, managed, or controlled by the village, as well as the appurtenant premises to such buildings notifying persons entering therein that weapons described in G.S. § 14-269(a) and G.S. § 14-415.10 are prohibited therein. The signage shall enumerate those weapons described in G.S. § 14-269(a) and G.S. § 14-415.10 which are: handguns, bowie knife, dirk, dagger, slung shot, loaded cane, metallic knuckles, razor, shurikin, stun gun, or other deadly weapon of like kind. The signage shall further note that the village prohibits firearms of any type in any building or appurtenant premise thereof owned or operated by the village. The signage shall further note that an ordinary pocket knife with a blade of less than five inches in length is not prohibited by village ordinance.

(D) *Location of signs.* The signs shall be visibly posted on the exterior of each entrance by which the general public can access the building or appurtenant premise. The Village Manager shall exercise discretion in determining the necessity and appropriate location for other signs posted on the interior of the building or appurtenant premises.

(E) *Violations.* Any person who possesses or carries a weapon on village property where prohibited shall be punished as provided by state law.

### **§ 130.03 DISCHARGE AND POSSESSION OF PROJECTILE WEAPONS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS.**

(A) *Discharge of firearms, generally.* It shall be unlawful within the village for any person to discharge a BB gun, pellet gun, air rifle, bow, crossbow, slingshot, dart thrower, paint gun or toy gun which propels any kind of projectile upon being discharged.

(B) *Non-application; exceptions.*

(1) *Non-application.* This section shall not apply to the discharge of a projectile weapon at or in a private residence, either one's own property, or the property of another, for which signed and dated written permission has been given to discharge a projectile weapon; provided that any projectile so discharged is contained on the property.

(2) *Exceptions.* This section shall not be construed as prohibiting discharge of a projectile weapon when used:

- (a) In defense of person or property;
- (b) To take birds or animals pursuant to G.S. Chapter 113, Subchapter IV, Game Laws;
- (c) Pursuant to lawful directions of law enforcement officers;

(d) By persons lawfully engaged in pest control or the taking of dangerous animals;

(e) At shooting ranges or places of business as authorized and approved for such purposes pursuant to zoning permit of the Village of Clemmons Unified Development Ordinances;

(f) By members of the armed forces acting in the line of duty; or

(g) At historic ceremonial or commemoration functions held for such purpose provided in no event shall live ammunition be used or discharged.

(C) *Possession of projectile weapons prohibited in certain places.* It shall be unlawful for any person to possess or carry, or to fire or discharge any projectile weapon on or in any building, park, recreation area or other property owned or operated by the village (whether within or outside the corporate limits), or on or in any public school building or grounds within the village or on or in any property within the village operated by or under the control of the Forsyth Municipal Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

(D) *Possession by minors.* It shall be unlawful for any minor person under 18 years of age, unless accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult person having custody of that child, to have any rifle or shotgun, or ammunition therefor, BB gun, pellet gun, air rifle, slingshot, or other projectile weapon in his or her possession at any place within the village, except on his or her own premises; or on any property owned or operated by the village outside of the corporate limits of the village. Any such projectile weapon in the possession of any person under 18 years of age who is not then accompanied by one of the persons named in this section and who is on premises other than his or her own shall be subject to seizure and confiscation by the law enforcement agencies.

(E) *Exclusions.*

(1) This section shall not apply to an officer lawfully discharging his or her duty, or to a watchman or other person specifically authorized to carry firearms on such premises while acting lawfully and within the scope of his or her authority; nor shall it prohibit the lawful possession or carrying of firearms on the public streets.

(2) None of the provisions of this section shall be construed so as to prohibit law enforcement officers from discharging firearms within the corporate limits of the village on any firing range maintained for the training of law enforcement officers when such firing is conducted for training purposes under the supervision and direction of an officer in charge of the training program.

(F) *Penalty.* Any violation of divisions (A), (C) or (D) of this section shall be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable as provided by law.

COUNTY OF FORSYTH

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2015, by and among THE VILLAGE OF CLEMMONS, hereinafter referred to as "THE VILLAGE" and FORSYTH COUNTY, hereinafter referred to as "THE COUNTY," on behalf of the FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE, hereinafter referred to as "FCSO" as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS THE VILLAGE has a desire and a need to provide law enforcement officers within its corporate boundaries in order to keep the peace, to enforce the criminal laws of the State of North Carolina, to enforce the ordinances established by THE COUNTY and THE VILLAGE and to maintain order in their Village; and

WHEREAS THE COUNTY is authorized to provide the services outlined herein pursuant to the provisions of N.C.G.S. 160A-461, et.seq; and

WHEREAS THE COUNTY acting through the FCSO is willing and agreeable to employ, to train, to assign and to supervise law enforcement officers from the Sheriff's Office to be assigned to THE VILLAGE at the expense of THE VILLAGE;

NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE as follows:

I. THE VILLAGE AGREES:

- A. To reimburse THE COUNTY for 100% of the contracted costs for law enforcement officers, which costs include: the officers' salaries and employee benefits, their uniforms, equipment, and vehicle replacement that is considered standard issue equipment; and all other operating and administrative expenses listed on Attachment A for one (1) Sergeant, one (1) Corporal, two (2) Investigators and nine (9) Deputy Sheriff's as estimated in Attachment A. In the event that more officers are requested to be assigned, the costs will be itemized for each additional officer requested to be assigned to THE VILLAGE;
- B. To reimburse THE COUNTY for the actual costs associated with the provision of law enforcement officers assigned to THE VILLAGE as outlined herein, which costs shall include salaries, benefits, training costs, equipment and supplies, and all other operating and administrative expenses listed on Attachment A hereto. In the event THE VILLAGE requests assignment to it of additional officers beyond the number identified in this Agreement, THE VILLAGE agrees to pay those additional costs associated with those additional officers as are designated by THE COUNTY. Actual costs shall be determined according to Section IV hereinbelow.

II. FORSYTH COUNTY AGREES:

- A. To provide one (1) Sergeant, one (1) Corporal, two (2) Investigators and nine (9) Deputy Sheriffs, fully equipped and fully trained law enforcement officers for duty in THE VILLAGE as soon as possible after the date of this agreement.

- B. To provide to THE VILLAGE, on a regular basis, statistical information relevant to the activities within the corporate limits of THE VILLAGE.
- C. To provide the necessary Police Professional Liability Insurance to protect THE COUNTY and the FCSO.

III. THE PARTIES AGREE:

That the law enforcement officers assigned to THE VILLAGE pursuant to this Agreement remain employees of the Forsyth County Sheriff at all times during the term of this Agreement. Under the general concept of community-based policing, these officers will be responsible for performing law enforcement duties within THE VILLAGE to include, but not be limited to: patrolling within THE VILLAGE; answering calls for service within THE VILLAGE; conducting general security checks within THE VILLAGE; and providing information and education to the public within THE VILLAGE and otherwise interacting with residents and visitors within THE VILLAGE. The VILLAGE agrees to obtain prior written approval from the Sheriff or his designee before assigning an officer provided under this Agreement to perform other or additional duties.

Notwithstanding the above, the parties understand and agree that the Forsyth County Sheriff's primary responsibility at all times is law enforcement and safety within all of Forsyth County and that circumstances may arise wherein the Sheriff determines it necessary to reassign one or more officers from THE VILLAGE for a given period of time in order to meet that primary responsibility.

IV. METHOD OF PAYMENT OF REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES

- A. It is understood and agreed that the estimated cost to THE VILLAGE shall be described in Attachment A for the upcoming year and for each following year of the contract.
- B. The parties agree that on or prior to March 31<sup>st</sup>, THE COUNTY will provide THE VILLAGE with an estimate of the costs which will be due and payable from THE VILLAGE to THE COUNTY for the provision of services under this Agreement for each subsequent twelve-month period of the Agreement. The parties agree that the actual costs of the providing services under this Agreement cannot be known prior to the completion of any particular twelve-month (June 30 – July 1) period of the Agreement. The parties agree that THE COUNTY will invoice THE VILLAGE on a quarterly basis for 25% of the estimated costs for that Agreement term for the first three quarters of the applicable twelve-month period. For the fourth quarter of the period THE COUNTY will invoice THE VILLAGE in accordance with the reconciliation, so that the total amount invoiced to and paid by THE VILLAGE are the actual costs to THE COUNTY of providing the services outlined in this Agreement. It is understood that if a vacancy occurs in the position allocated to THE VILLAGE that THE VILLAGE will not be billed for any salary and/or benefit costs for the position for the duration of the vacancy.
- C. THE VILLAGE agrees to make payment of an invoice within fifteen (15) days of receipt of such invoice from THE COUNTY.

V. TERM OF AGREEMENT

- A. The term of this Agreement is two years, commencing from July 1, 2015 and ending on June 30, 2017.

B. The Agreement may be extended for additional and successive terms unless terminated by one of the parties in the manner as provided below.

VI. AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT

The Agreement may be amended or modified only by agreement of both parties in writing.

VII. TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT

The Agreement may be terminated by any party upon giving ninety (90) days Notice of Termination in writing to the other parties to the Agreement. THE VILLAGE agrees to reimburse THE COUNTY for any and all expenses incurred under the terms and conditions of this Agreement up to the date of termination.

## **Tourism/Occupancy Tax Grant Application**

### ***2015 Timeline:***

- **Friday, May 15** – Application process posted on Village website
- **Friday, May 29 @ 10:00 a.m.** – Application Workshop at Village Hall
- **Monday, June 22** – Applications Due by 5PM
- **Monday, July 27** – Funding recommendations reviewed/approved by Council; funding announced via on-line and e-mail to all applicants; media advisory issued within 24 hours of e-mail notification.

### ***Available Funding***

The Village of Clemmons anticipates a total of \$45,000 will be available in the 2015-2016 Tourism Grant Program. Funding requests from \$500 (minimum) to \$10,000 (maximum) will be considered. Due to limited funding, the Village may fund a project at less than 100 percent of the requested amount.

### ***Important Guidelines/Requirements:***

- **Types of Projects Eligible for Funding:**
  - i. **For-profit:** Must be a project related to an event or the event itself; or
  - ii. **Nonprofit:** Events/Projects/Programs that bring cultural, economic, and recreational value to the Village of Clemmons. A minimum of 65% of the grant money available will be awarded to requests attracting tourists or business travelers to the area.
- **Funds are reimbursement only** (To receive payment, grantees are required to provide copies of paid invoices/receipts within 30 days after the event. Hold all invoices until they total the full amount of your grant. Only one reimbursement check will be issued per organization due to increased processing expense.)
- **Funds will not be granted for normal and routine operating and administrative expenses of the organization applying.** Routine expenses include postage; telephone charges;

- shipping, salaries, bonuses, lodging, transportation, or entertainment costs for any staff member, consultant or other employee of an applying agency or organization.
- Funds requested and approved must be expended in one fiscal year (*Village of Clemmons fiscal year is July 1st to June 30<sup>th</sup>*).
  - If the requesting agency conducts a financial audit, the Village requires a copy of the audit report and the auditors management letter (if any) within 90 days following the end of the agency's fiscal year.
  - The Village, at its discretion, *may require an independent audit* or examination of any agency's financial records by the Village's Finance Officer before approval of funding.
  - All records supporting the disbursement of funds must be retained for a period of three years.
  - Only one proposal may be submitted per organization. If your organization is listed as a partner in one proposal, it is still eligible to apply as the lead grant recipient in another proposal.
  - Submissions must be formatted to correspond to and be in alignment with the application outline.
  - The applicant **MUST** provide a minimum of 33% in matching funds or in-kind services from other sources. Proposals that do not meet this minimum match requirement will be **DISQUALIFIED**.
  - Application must receive a minimum of 60 points to be eligible for funding.
  - Village staff shall review all applications and recommend awards to the Village of Clemmons Council who will make final funding decisions and shall have sole authority in granting and disbursing funds.
  - Proposals must be *received* by the deadline - *NOT postmarked* by the deadline.
  - Additional requirements may be imposed by the Council.

### **Forsyth County has a 6% Occupancy Tax Rate**

#### *Of the first 3%:*

- 1) *5% divided among the municipalities other than Winston-Salem on a pro rata basis-* Used only for economic development and cultural & recreational purposes.
- 2) *Remainder to the Tourism Development Authority-* Used to further the development of travel, tourism, and conventions.

#### *Of the remaining 3%:*

- 1) *5% divided among the municipalities other than Winston-Salem on a pro rata basis-* Used only for economic development and cultural & recreational purposes.
- 2) *1/3 of the remaining proceeds to the Tourism Development Authority-* Used to further the development of travel, tourism, and conventions.
- 3) *10% of the remaining proceeds divided among municipalities other than Winston-Salem, in which taxable establishments are located, in proportion to the amount of tax proceeds collected in each municipality-* At least 2/3 must be used to promote travel & tourism; remainder used for tourism-related expenditures.
- 4) *Remainder divided between Winston-Salem and Forsyth County on a pro rata basis-* Used only for economic development and cultural & recreational purposes.
